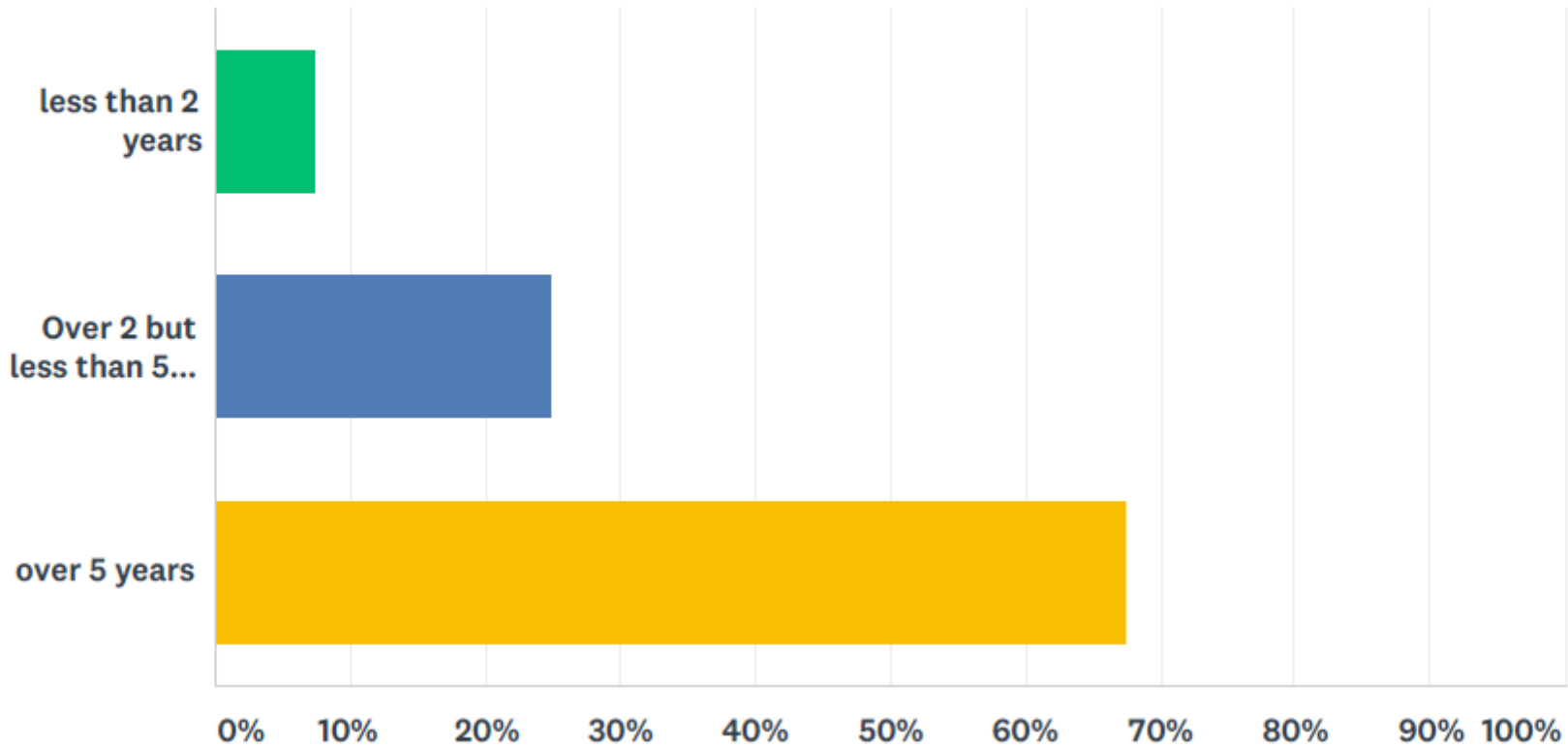

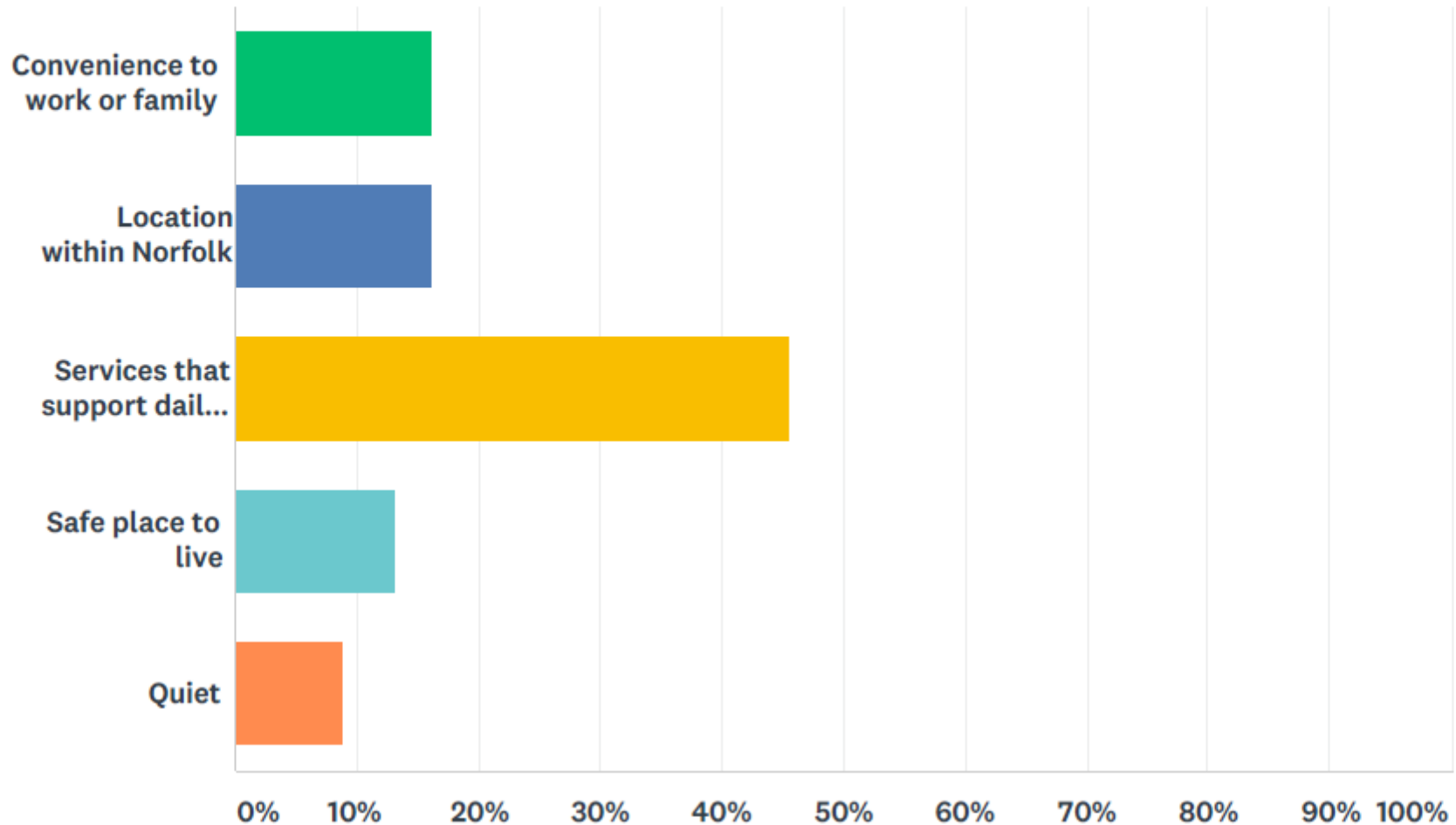
Q1 How long have you lived in Necton?

Answered: 68 Skipped: 1



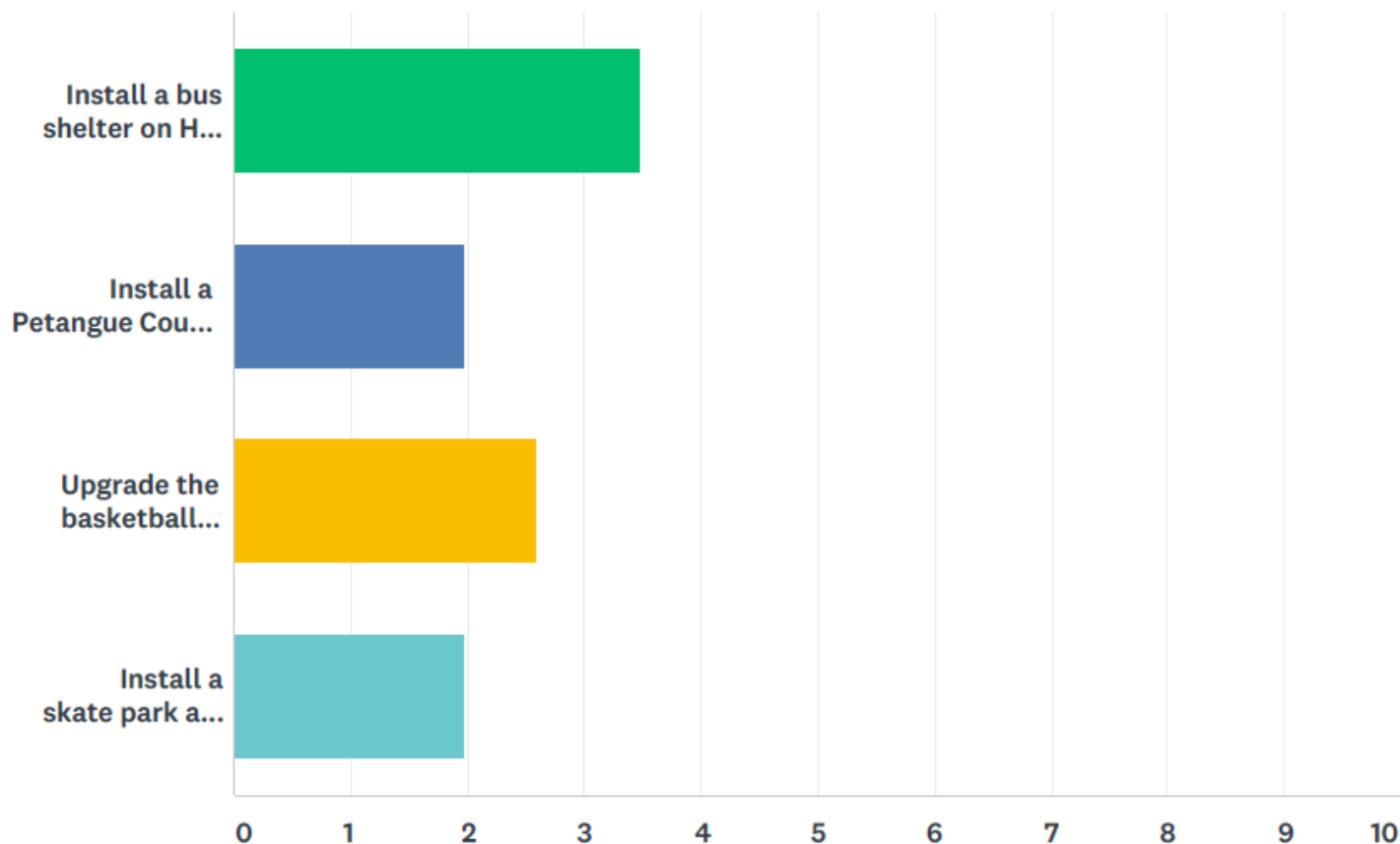
Q2 What is most important to you about Necton?

Answered: 68 Skipped: 1



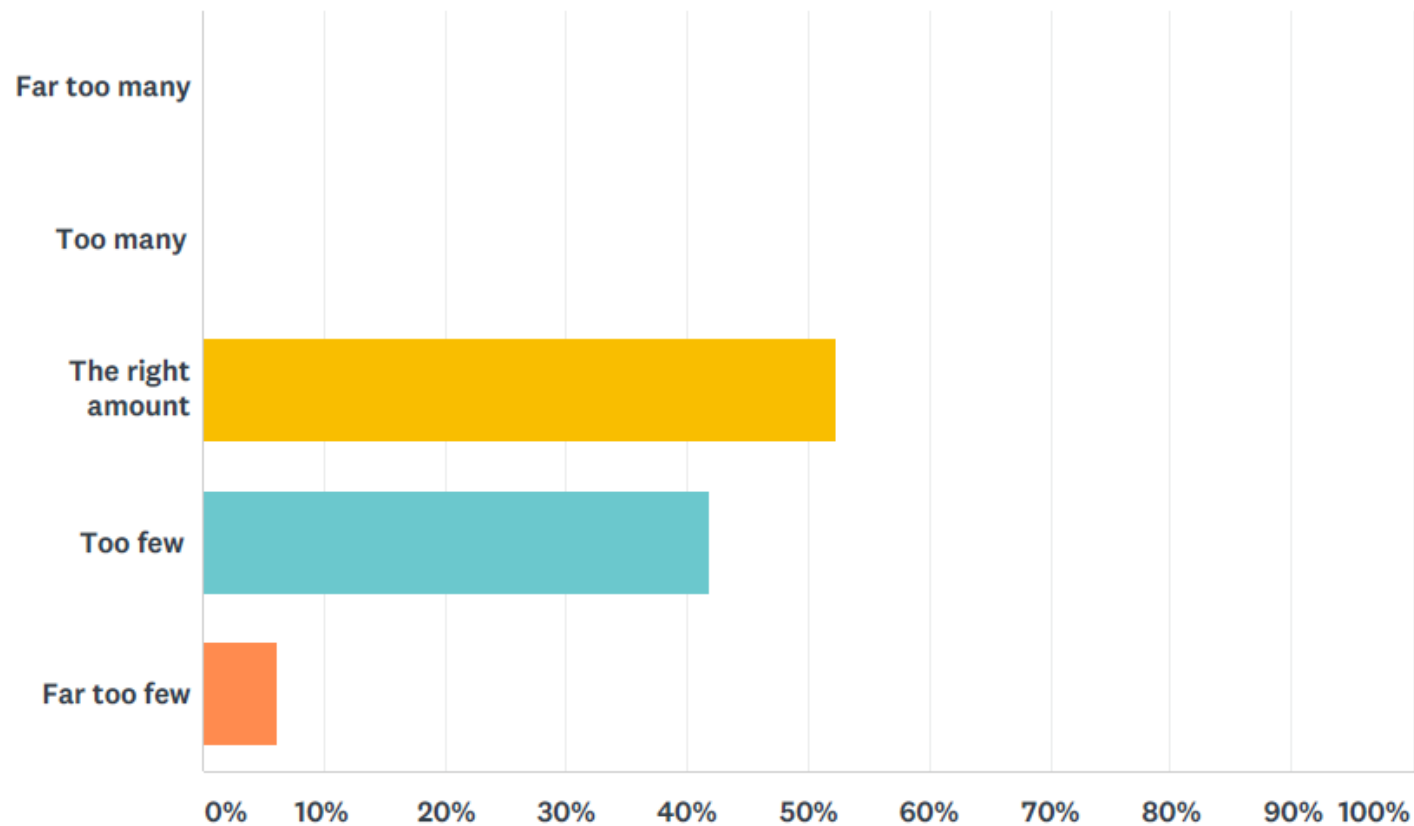

Answered: 65 Skipped: 4



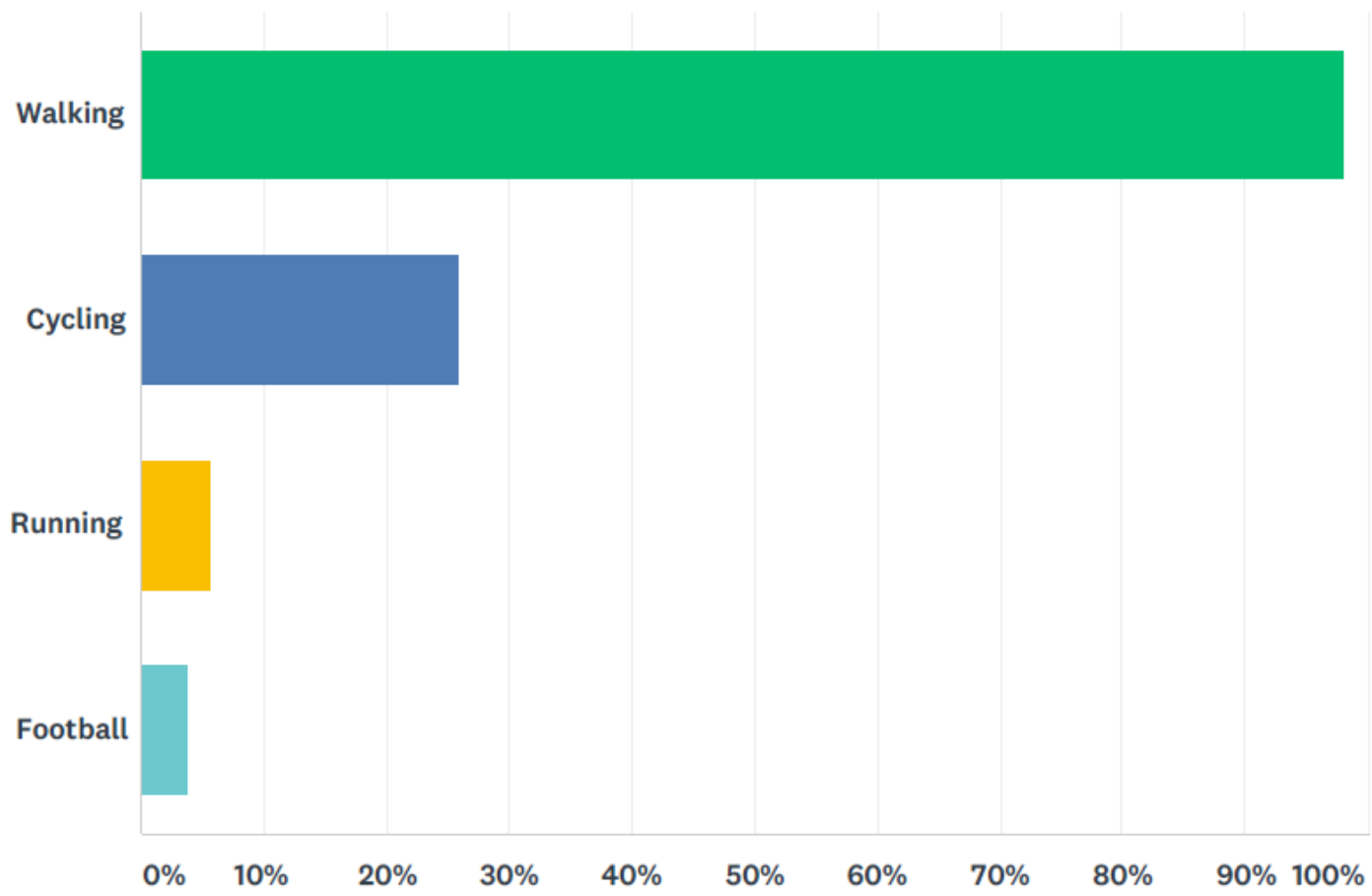
Q4 Does Necton have too many, too few, or about the right number of public spaces?

Answered: 67 Skipped: 2



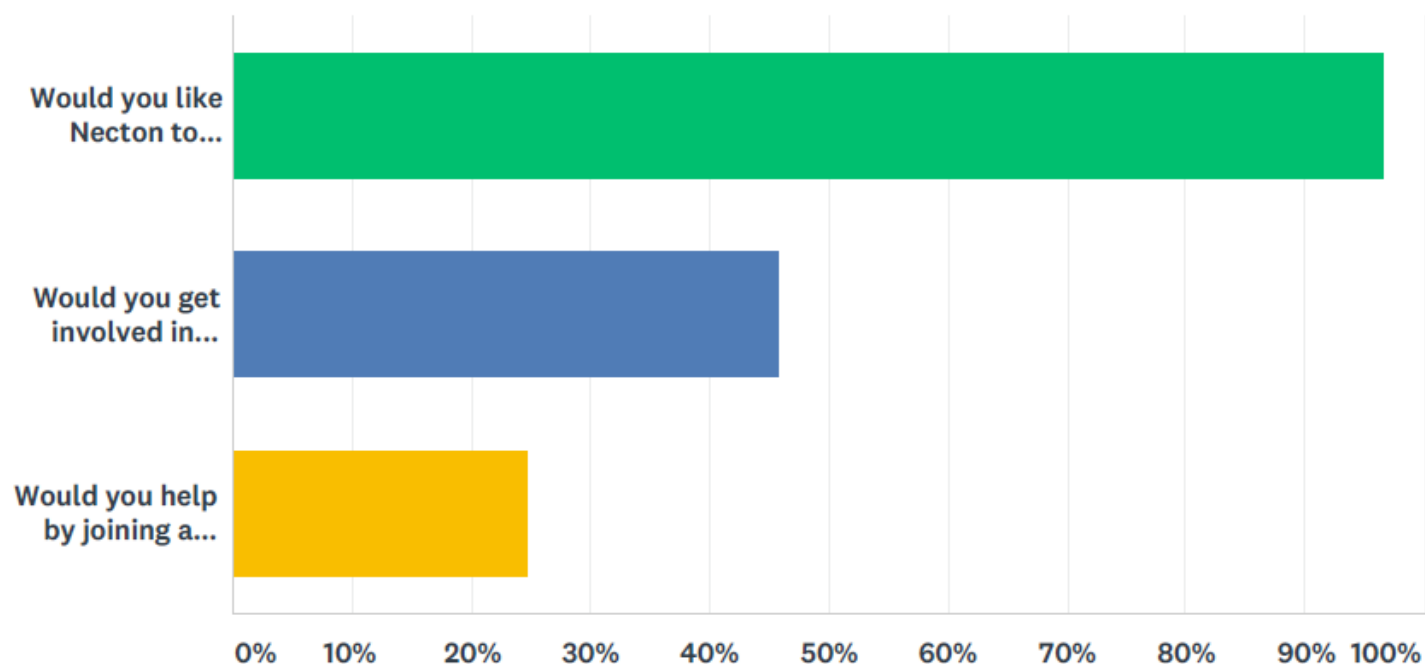
Q5 Do you participate in any of the following outdoor activities within Necton. Tick all that apply regularly (more than twice a month)

Answered: 54 Skipped: 15



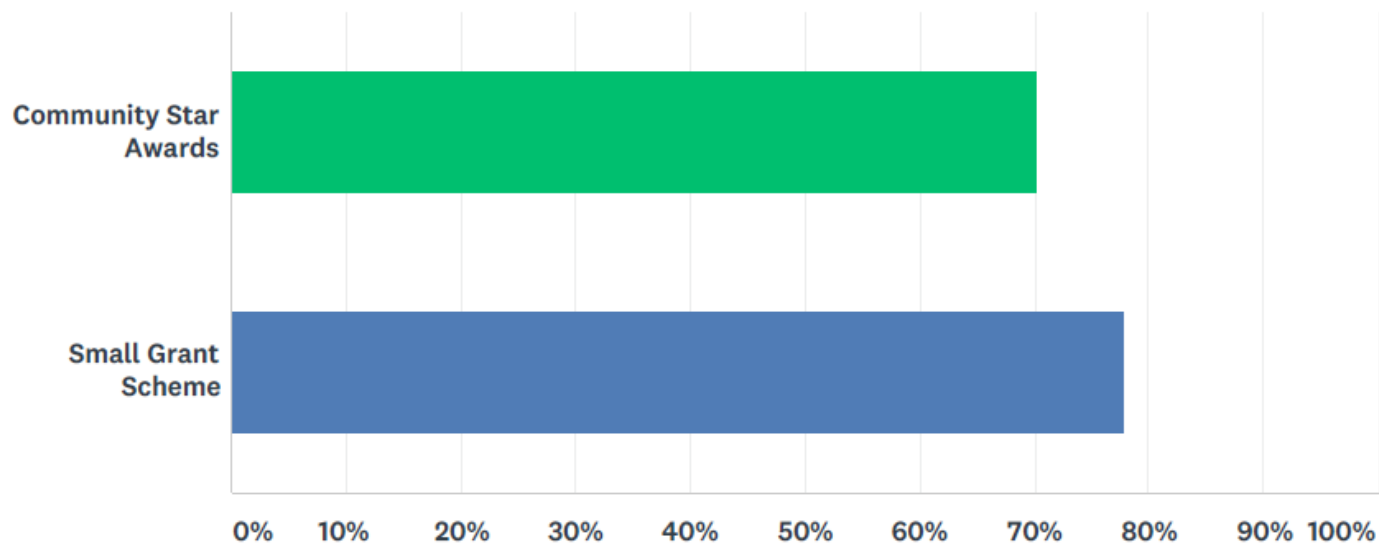

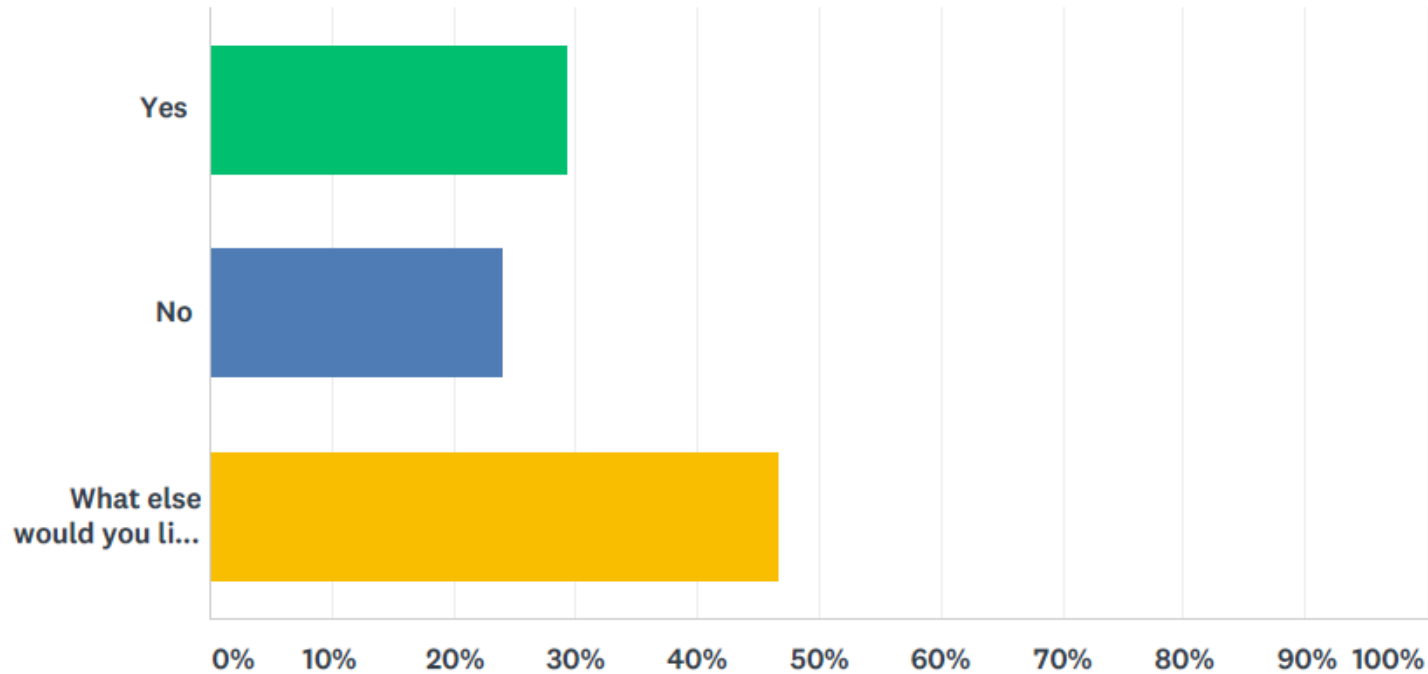
