Ken Barrett has already become a champion for Necton in dealing with the ongoing lighting issues on the A47.

New & improved facilities

- Further tranche of streetlighting upgraded to low energy LED units
- Trod extension between Ramms Lane and Black Drift completed



- Replaced damaged dog bins.
- Community Garden behind the Community Centre completed
- Car park at the Community Centre refreshed, parking bays reinstated and pot holes filled
- New noticeboards erected to replace the old ones, ensuring more notices can be put up and remain in a good condition
- Land known as the Marl Pit purchased. This will become a natural area for residents to enjoy
- New projector purchased- this will support our carbon footprint by reducing the amount of paper the Parish Council uses

Upgraded the play area by completing the first phase of the new MUGA




Continued development and community engagement

- Equipped our councillors with professional local government training
- Employed a new Clerk, Parish Assistant and a new caretaker
- Secured a new bus stop at the top of Tuns Road following discussions with residents and local bus company
- Over development fears- keeping on the PC meeting agenda, meeting with Breckland Planning to keep the village voice heard and concerns registered.
- Councillors attended meetings and submitted reports, models, questions and suggestions to the Planning Inspectorate regarding the Vattenfall and Boreas Projects.
 Ongoing discussions with George Freeman MP to secure best outcomes for Necton and even a visit to Westminster to ensure the village voice was heard.
- The PC continued to engage with the relevant authorities and housing associations regarding the ongoing drainage and flooding issues. Round table meetings being arranged to resolve the issues with all relevant parties to be present.
- The PC liaised on a weekly basis with Highways England to resolve the ongoing issues with the lights on the A47


Receipts during 2019/20



Misc credits include monies raised by the Necton Festival and thereafter paid out to local charities


Grants included monies from the \$106 fund which supported the purchase of the Marl pit.

Parish Council grants to local organisations during 2019/20

- Necton 1st Brownies -£250.00 to support their travel costs for the annual Seaside Sparke trip to Great Yarmouth

Necton Community Centre

Necton Parish Council took over as sole trustee of Necton Rural Community Centre in October 2015. This allowed the long-standing management committee to finally retire.

The Council carry out their trustee responsibilities through the NRCC committee, which meets bi-monthly. Meetings are open to the public and minutes are published on the Parish Council's website.

The Parish Assistant is responsible for the operational activities and is supported by a long-standing Cleaner, a Caretaker and a small team of volunteers.

Finances of the community centre are completely independent of the Parish Council finances. They are managed by the Parish Assistant and overseen by the Parish Clerk.

The headline figures for year end 31 March 2020 are as follows:

Receipts £23,685.90

Payments £22,942.31

Balance in bank £16,717.63


Looking ahead – our priorities for 2020/2021

- To commence with the creation of a Neighbourhood Plan. This is a very lengthy and
 extensive piece of work and will take some time to complete. The PC will be looking to
 a grant to support with the costs related to this.
- Breckland Local Plan continuing to engage with Breckland Council to ensure future development meets the village needs.
- Vattenfall sub-station continuing to engage in the consultation process to ensure the best possible outcome for the community.
- To set up a Drop-in session at the Community Centre- this will provide a hub for residents to come and have a cuppa and a chat and will actively look to encourage residents to meet, chat and socialise. If successful the sessions may be expanded.
